

# Ziprasidone

## Quick Reference Guide for Teachers

Ziprasidone is used to treat mood disorders such as schizophrenia or manic/mixed episodes associated with bipolar disorder. Ziprasidone helps to reduce feelings of nervousness, and improves concentration.

<b>Possible Side Effects</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dizziness</li> <li>• Drowsiness</li> <li>• Weakness</li> <li>• Vomiting</li> <li>• Runny nose, cough</li> <li>• Mood changes</li> <li>• Restlessness</li> <li>• Shaking (tremors)</li> <li>• Muscle spasm/stiffness</li> <li>• Numbness</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trouble swallowing</li> <li>• Vision problems</li> <li>• Difficulty walking</li> <li>• Chest pain</li> <li>• Fainting</li> <li>• Jaw/left arm pain</li> <li>• Slow/fast/irregular heartbeat</li> <li>• Seizures</li> </ul>
	Signs of infection: Fever, Persistent sore throat	

<b>When To Get Help</b>	<p><b>Seek immediate medical help if you see:</b></p> <p>Symptoms of a serious allergic reaction:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rash</li> <li>• Itching/swelling (of face/tongue/throat)</li> <li>• Severe dizziness</li> <li>• Trouble breathing</li> </ul>
	<p>In rare cases, Ziprasidone can cause a condition called Tardive Dyskinesia. Symptoms include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Unusual uncontrolled movements of the face, mouth, tongue, arms, or legs</li> </ul> <p>Ziprasidone can also cause a serious condition called Serotonin Syndrome. Symptoms include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hallucinations</li> <li>• Unusual restlessness</li> <li>• Loss of coordination</li> <li>• Fast heartbeat</li> <li>• Severe dizziness</li> <li>• Unexplained fever</li> <li>• Severe nausea/vomiting/diarrhea</li> <li>• Twitching muscles</li> </ul>
